

New York guidelines on how to dispense and distribute medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD)

Office of Addiction Services and Supports' (OASAS) mission "is to improve the lives of all New Yorkers by leading a premier system of addiction services through prevention, treatment, and recovery." The office's website outlines ways to support, develop, and work with stakeholders on prevention, treatment, and recovery to combat addiction while supporting providers.

<u>Laws and regulations</u> compiled by OASAS include federal and New York State laws that guide addiction service providers in the certification process and all applicable regulations. These include part <u>822</u>, regulations for outpatient programs including opioid treatment programs (OTPs); part <u>810</u>, general standards for certification; part 800, general provisions for all providers; and part <u>814</u>, general facility requirements.

Registering to be an OTP: application and <u>certification</u> must be completed.
